Tommy Bennett is Associate Professor and Wall Family Fellow at the MU School of Law and the Kinder Institute on Constitutional Democracy, where he teaches courses in constitutional law and civil procedure. He researches and writes on topics of judicial federalism: the twin relationships between state and federal courts, on the one hand, and state and federal law, on the other. Bennett's academic writing has been published or is forthcoming in the NYU Law Review, the Cornell Law Review, the Minnesota Law Review, and the Notre Dame Law Review, and his work has been cited by the United States Supreme Court.



Before joining the faculty at the University of Missouri, Bennett was a Furman Academic Fellow at NYU School of Law. Before academia, he spent four years in private practice in Washington, D.C., where he represented clients in appeals, complex civil litigation, and before administrative agencies. He also served as law clerk to the Honorable Gerard E. Lynch of the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit and the Honorable Jesse M. Furman of the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York. Bennett is a graduate of Swarthmore College and NYU School of Law.
